

Women Linked to Peace: At the 12th Nobel Peace Laureates World Summit in Chicago, April 2012, former President Jimmy Carter spoke up to stand up against unnecessary wars, to hold government accountable for preemptive strikes, and to wage war only after all means of resolution failed. He urged a closer scrutiny of economic sanctions that will feed starving children and simultaneously sanction corrupt leaders, noting that the U.S. has engaged in wars completely unnecessary.
