#### In Case You Missed It...

AAUW has extended the membership renewal grace period deadline in Community Hub to extend through November 30th. This ensures continuity of membership for those who are still renewing, but does not change their expiration date for 2023 (ie: if you have an expiration date of 6/30/22 and you renew on 11/1/22, your expiration date will be 6/30/23 - if you renew 12/30/22, which is past the grace period, your expiration date will be 12/29/23).



**Coalitions / Collaborations / Contributions** 

As we strive to work with like-minded organizations to advance our mission, it is important to keep in mind some guidelines.

**Coalitions** exist between AAUW and outside / external organizations who overlap with our issues for a limited period for time with a specific purpose, such as calls to action, rallies, encouraging members to contact legislators or write letters. These coalition partners can change over time depending on the issues addressed. Some coalition partners have been NAACP, ACLU, NOW, League of Women Voters, domestic violence groups, and even unions such as the Illinois Federation of Teachers. However, it is important to double check that we remain nonpartisan while supporting actions that address our mission.

**Collaborations** exist between and among sister branches inside or outside the state. This is encouraged to maximize our impact and to maximize community involvement. Together, we can make a difference.

**Contributions** (to coalition partners or other entities) cannot be made in the name of AAUW or AAUW-IL unless approved by the state board. However, we do not intervene in anyone's right or ability to make individual contributions to whatever causes they want to support. The issue is tying the name of AAUW to unapproved activities.


