On March 9, <u>you received a ballot</u> in your email with the **slate of state officers** who will be installed at our April Convention. Your vote counts, so make sure you return your ballot as soon as possible.

**AAUW-IL 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Convention** takes place on April 19 & 20 at Elgin Community College. The registration form came out several weeks ago. **A discounted rate is available until March 18.** You can still register after that date; however, you will not be able to use the discounted rate after March 18. A link to the registration form follows.

Our Program VPs have put together a **celebration of AAUW in Illinois for the past 100 years**! You will not want to miss this Convention!

- We celebrate branches this is an opportunity for your branch historians to show us their work. You can create a display highlighting your branch and its history and activities, or a prominent member or a project you would like to share with your sister branches.
- We welcome **Meghan Kissell**, the Director of Public Policy and Advocacy from National, who is, among other duties, responsible for the Lobby Core and our outreach activities, such as Get Out the Vote.
- **Dr. Suzanne Chod**, Professor of Political Science at North Central College, presents "Truth. Trust, and Turnout" and will give us guidance on navigating mis/disinformation.
- Ms. Ahlam Jbara, Chief of Staff for the IDHS Division of Family & Community Services will supplement our One Book / One State reading group. She addresses the issues surrounding

- The ERA has still not been certified by the Archivist to our Constitution. AJ Conroy will guide us
  on what our next steps should be to make sure that the ERA becomes the law of the land.
- You will have an opportunity to exchange best practices in Affinity Group sessions.
- What will the next 100 years for AAUW-IL be? You weigh in!
- As at every Convention, you will have time to renew acquaintances, meet new colleagues and gain insights and perspectives that can be applied in your branches.

You have another role to play in the future of AAUW – the **vote on Open Membership** will occur between April 3 and May 15. On March 28, the Jane Addams branch will host a state wide webinar on the case for expanding our membership opportunities; the registration link is below. Your State Board has voted unanimously to approve open membership. During the last vote on open membership, all Illinois branches voted to approve by 75% this membership Bylaws change; however, only 30% of Illinois members voted. We want to improve that percentage and become a leader among the states. <u>Here is a link</u> for more information about this important vote. Currently only 39% of women have degrees. We are losing the opportunity to engage with 61% of women who might support our mission!

**March is Women's History Month and March 13 was Equal Pay Day**. Women still earn only 84% of what men earn. So, a woman must work until mid-March to earn an equivalent salary to what a man earns by December of the previous year. For our sisters of color the timeframe is even worse. One way to celebrate is to contact your legislators to encourage them to support wage and benefits fairness for all workers, including doing away with salary history questions, which can adversely affect women. It is unfair and frankly un-American that women are not paid the same as a man for doing the same work.
