In Illinois we are fortunate that the state makes voting as easy as possible for all citizens. The Illinois State Board of Elections website (https://elections.il.gov) includes a wealth of information and access points for your use. You can check your registration status and register if needed. You can request a vote by mail ballot, check early voting sites or your location for in-person voting.

As the campaigns progress it is important to be able to distinguish Fact from Fiction. UC Berkley has a website that provides information on this and links to reliable sites. One that I have used frequently is Snopes (https://www.snopes.com). It is reliable and easy to use.

All elections are important, but this seems more important than many for Equality, Women's rights, Voting rights and more. Karen and I look forward to working with you to be a part of the process and advance AAUW priorities.


The Dignity Index Training

Elgin AAUW along with The **Batavia**, **St. Charles**, **Geneva and Naperville** sister branches met on September 5 to learn how best to introduce The Dignity Index concept to our members.

The Dignity Index scores distinct phrases along an eight-point scale from contempt to dignity. Lower scores (1-4) reflect divisive language while higher scores (5-8) reflect language grounded in dignity. By focusing on the speech and not the speaker, the Dignity Index is designed to draw our attention away from the biases of partisan politics and toward the power we each have to heal our country and each other.

Our Elgin members were unanimously impressed with the training we received from the panel of experts. Co-Presidents Jennifer Ford and Judi Tepe are excited to be partnering with this dynamic branch and are committed to planning more events in the near future.
