AAUW IL - Fall Conference

The conference had a strong emphasis on being prepared to participate in the November 5, 2024 election. Dr. Nolan Higdon provided the Keynote "Manipulated Realities: Fake News, AI, and the Future of Electoral Politics." In it he explored the critical intersections of fake news, disinformation, artificial intelligence (AI), and electoral politics. A Public Policy update was shared by Karen Kortsch and Ken Olson. They included a reminder of things that Branches can and cannot do relative to elections as well as current AAUW priorities that can guide our choices for the coming election. An overview of the current situation in Congress was provided as well as reminders to vote on election day or by using one of the early voting options. Vote by mail is open now and early voting is or will soon be open in all areas of the state. Links to useful election information include:

News on the ERA front

One of the longstanding priorities of AAUW is assuring equality for all. Legislatively a needed action is inclusion of the Equal Rights Amendment in the Constitution. We always appreciate having other well-respected organizations join in this effort. Recently the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists ("ACOG"), along with the American Society for Reproductive Medicine, American Urogynecologic Maternal-Fetal Medicine, and the Society for Reproductive Endocrinology and Infertility, issued a Statement acknowledging the Equal Rights Amendment ("ERA") must be published as the 28th Amendment to the US Constitution to ensure "exceptional and respectful obstetric and gynecologic care is accessible to all." In doing so, these organizations, who represent OB-GYNs and fertility experts across the country, urged the Biden/Harris Administration "to do everything in their power to finalize the Equal Rights Amendment so that the promise of equal rights under the law, including the right to access comprehensive reproductive health care such as abortion, may be realized."
