- 2. NASPA, previously known as the National Association of Student Personnel Administrators, updated their name to the Student Affairs Administrators in Higher Education but continues to use the well-known NASPA acronym. NASPA and AAUW share a commitment to advancing leadership and equity in education. NASPA has been organizing impactful leadership events for over a century. This long history exemplifies NASPA's extensive experience and commitment to developing student leaders.
- 3. Branches may still contribute to NCCWSL scholarships via AAUW. 80% of funds donated will be allocated toward direct scholarship support (registration fees only not inclusive of travel or incidentals) and 20% of funds donated will be allocated toward the staff time and other direct administrative costs associated with managing the scholarship program.
- 4. Registration fees and the timing for registering students will be decided by NASPA and communicated to branches on the pages listed below and in AAUW newsletters when available. Branches may still choose to register students once the registration dates are provided.
- 5. At the time this article was written, the next NCCSWL was scheduled for May 28 May 30, 2025, in College Park, MD.

Recognizing the need to be focused as well as our history AAUW looks to prioritize higher education and domestic issues. AAUW likely will not be in position to comment on all issues of concern but will support coalition efforts to address many issues. At the state level there are challenges, but it still operates in an orderly manner The budget will be a major issue as the state faces a significant deficit while the situation in Washington creates more uncertainty relative to additional financial needs for the state as a result of administration and Congressional action. We are currently reviewing bills submitted for consideration in this session for support or opposition. We will coordinate with various coalition partners to provide a uniform message. 
