Public Policy

The Illinois lame duck session of the 103rd General Assembly just finished up January 7 and on January 8th the inauguration of new legislators and the start of the 104th General Assembly took place. Karina's Bill, which would allow guns to be removed from domestic abusers finally passed the Senate during the 103rd GA (President Harmon held it up in the Spring pending a supreme court case decision) and the house concurred. As I write this, the new session has only begun so we don't yet have information on what bills will be introduced this session. When Jenni, our lobbyist, gets a list together, Ken and I will get regular updates on what bills we may want to support. There may be witness slips to file or letters to legislators to be written. We will get that info to you through the public policy mailing list and hopefully people on that list will pass it along to their chapter members. There will probably be a lot of bills to consider and we will choose to focus on those that align with our AAUW values and Public Policy priorities.

The Public Policy priorities are currently being revised by the National office and you should have received an email titled **Dues Change and Governance Proposals – Comment Now!** That email includes a link to review and comment on Public Policy priorities updates. If you did not receive the email please go to the AAUW website and look for this information. Also make sure you are subscribed to receive email notices from the National office.


Mary Elvira Weeks and The Discovery of the Elements
